How?

Take 21 semester hours from Stephen F. Austin State University (SFASU) locally through distance education at Region 10 Education Service Center in Richardson.

What is Distance Education?

Courses are offered through video conferencing at Region 10 ESC and supplemented with an internet component.

How many classes are required for certification?

Six courses and a practicum (21 semester hours) are required to obtain certification, as well as passing EXCET exams.

When do the courses begin?

The courses will begin in the summer of 2010. However you **MUST** register with SFASU for the graduate program and for the grant by **Mid- March, 2010**.

When can I begin working as a teacher of the visually impaired?

In the fall of 2010, you may be employed as a teacher of the visually impaired under special permit.
